

**CIVIC ADDRESSING
TO PROVIDE FOR THE ORDERLY NUMBERING OF LANDS & BUILDINGS**

Council for the Village of Galahad has enacted Bylaw No. 02-11 to be called the “Civic Addressing Bylaw”. Authority to enact this bylaw is given by the Municipal Government Act, Section 58(1)

This civic addressing system will enable emergency response personnel, utility companies, couriers, and others visitors to the Village to find your residence/property quicker.

The map attached has all lots/properties within the Village boundaries assigned a street name and lot number. These are the numbers assigned by the Village and are the numbers which are referred to in the bylaw as ‘address numbers’.

The Owner/Resident of a property shall display, at all times, the Address Number, at a location plainly visible from the roadway.

Any property owner which has access to a lane(alley) shall, in addition to displaying an Address Number to the roadway, display the Address Number from the lane(alley).

Every legally registered parcel of land that is bordered by streets shall display the Address Number at all times. (This includes vacant parcel/lots.)

The minimum size of the characters to be displayed shall be:

Distance set back from Curb	Character Size
0 - 15 meters (0 - 50 feet)	10 cm (4 inches)
15 - 20 meters (50 - 65 feet)	15 cm (6 inches)
Greater than 20 meters (65 feet)	20 cm (8 inches)

The Owner of a parcel which is a construction site and for which a structure is being erected, shall ensure that a temporary Address Number is displayed.
